## News From Ireland and Elsewhere

- Theresa May withstood a vote of no-confidence recently and will remain the leader of the UK conservative party for the foreseeable future, though she still needs to have her Brexit deal approved.
- Chocolate everywhere!!! A small "technical glitch" at a German chocolate factory caused a ton of the liquid goodness to ooze onto a local street. When the warm chocolate met a frigid Mother Nature it solidified and required firefighters to use shovels, pry bars and torches to clear the street.
- Ian Paisley Jr, son of Ian Paisley, who is a member of parliament in Northern Ireland, has found himself in hot water again.
