News From Ireland and Elsewhere

- The Irish economy is growing in 2017 with the forecast for increase in GDP (5%), consumer spending (3.4%), and employment (2.8%). The average mortgage approved for first-time buyers in February was €206,500.
- John Glavey, senior barman at Knock Airport, won a €6,500 discrimination complaint after Labour Court ruled that he was illegally forced to retire at age 65. Irish citizens can qualify for state pension at age 66, though the age rises to 67 in 2021, and 68 in 2028.
- The number of international tourists traveling to Ireland during January-March 2017 was mixed. British visitors were down 6.5%, while increases were seen from North America (23%), Australia (16%), France (10%) and Spain (4.5%). Ireland's reliance on British tourists is evident as the overall increase of foreign visitors was just 1%.
- On May 13th Cardinal Dolan will celebrate a Mass of Thanksgiving for John Curry, who at age 5, was the youngest person to witness the apparition of Our Lady on August 21, 1897 at Knock. Curry emigrated to America, never married, and lived with the Sisters of The Poor for years before his death in 1943. The Sisters buried him in an unmarked grave in Pine Lawn Cemetery. Curry seldom spoke of what he saw, but gave testimony in 1937 as part of the Church's investigation. During Cardinal Dolan's 2015 trip to Knock, the parish priest said he was worried about Curry's unmarked grave. Dolan said "We should move him to St. Patrick's." Curry will be reburied at The Basilica of St. Patrick's Old Cathedral in lower Manhattan in a ceremony that will include 130 pilgrims from Ireland.
